# Christie taps 11 lawyers for state Superior Court

Governor Christie on Tuesday nominated 11 lawyers to become state Superior Court judges, including the nine previously reported by The Record as likely to be chosen for positions in Bergen County.

The two additional nominations announced by the governor's office are both in Union County: Richard C. Wischusen, 54, of Cranford; and John G. Hudak, 57, of Linden.

The governor also nominated two judges for reappointment to the Superior Court: Lisa P. Thornton, 50, of Neptune to the court in Monmouth County; and Rudolph A. Filko, 52, of Wayne, in Passaic County.

The lawyers nominated for appointment to the Superior Court

in Bergen County are Deborah M. Gross-Quatrone, 52, of Saddle Brook; James J. DeLuca, 62, of Midland Park; Gregg A. Padovano, 44, of Maywood; James X. Sattely, 49, of Oradell; Walter F. Skrod, 63, of Mahwah; Magali M. Francois, 53, of Glen Rock; Mark T. Janeczko, 60, of Wood-Ridge; Jane Gallina-Mecca, 55, of Paramus and Christopher R. Kazlau, 46, of Washington Township.

In addition, the governor nominated three Bergen County lawyers to be Workers' Compensation judges: John C. Gavejian of Mahwah, Michael J. Dillon of Teaneck and Thomas J. Ludlum of Glen Rock.

Thomas Morgan Hurley of Ridgewood was nominated to be an administrative law judge.

All the nominees are subject to confirmation by the New Jersey Senate.
